AliceName Alice, meaning no nobility or noble born, consistently ranked the top 20 girls' names during the early 19th century, but its popularity began to wade during the '40s and '50s, dropping down to the 112th to the end of the decade. However, in recent years, it has begun to experience something of a rebirth, and was ranked the 76th most popular baby name for girls in 2016 by the Social Security Administration (SSA). BettyWhile is sometimes used as the nickname Elizabeth, Betty is a beautiful name all by herself. Meaning Oath or God is my oath, Betty was most prevalent back in 1934 when it ranked as the second most popular girls name in the country. We think it is time for revenge. CharlotteCharlotte, the feminized form of Charles, has long been a name associated with British royalties. Although somewhat widely used during the 1940s, its popularity reached a rank of 47 on the U.S. baby name charts, and didn't crack ten until Will and Kate the little princess arrived in 2015. According to the SSA, ClaraPerhaps bring to mind nutcracker ballet, Clara means bright or light, or remarkable, and, like Alice, the old school name is experiencing something of a rise in popularity right now. In 1890 it was the 9th most popular girl in the children's name in the country; 100 years later, it had fallen to 515 in 1990, and in 2017 it cracked the top 100 words again, which was 99 points in the SSA charts. Kofani downton abbey immediately recognizes this name, which means a filled heart. Cora was a very popular name for girls in the late 1800s, but it has recently seen a slight resurgence, and in 2017 ranked 83rd in the SSA charts. Meaning all or universal, Emma was a very popular name in the US during the late 1800s, but slowly fell out of favor; However, it has been steadily climbing ranks since the late '80s and found itself at the top of SSA data in 2016.HattieA sweet nickname Harriet, Hattie stands for ruler of the house. It was quite common during the late 1800s, and slowly climbing the popularity charts again. In 2009, it ranked 1764 in the SSA classification; last year Hattie almost broke into the top girls' names holding a steady number of 503.JosephineMedeme version of the word Josephine means the name means God will rise or God will add. At one point, Josephine was the 21st most common baby name in the country, and is constantly making his way back to the top of the chart after a decades-long decline in popularity. In 1987, for example, it ranked as the 498th most popular girls' name, and in 2016 it can be found on the list of 114.Margaret Margaret Margaret has another name associated with the British royal family, namely the Queen's misfortune sister Princess Margaret. It has several meanings: pearl and flower, and can be found in ten children's names in the country for years, from the late 1800s to 1930s. In recent years it has slightly decreased SSA rankings, coming in at 139 in 2016. Victor BlackmanGetty Images MyrtleWhile Myrtle used to be a fairly popular name in the United States (ranking the top 50 names for girls consistently from 1900 to 1912), it has since fallen out of fashion and has been billed as a comeback. The natural inspired name has several meanings, including love, good luck and prosperity. OliveOlive is another name that has seen a resurgence recently. Female form Oliver ranked in the top 100 names for baby girls in the early 1900s, but had fallen all the way to the 990th of the most popular in 2007. By 2017 it had bounced back, coming in at 256.Roselt began to pick up steam in 2010, and has been steadily growing for the past few years (perhaps partly due to Lily James's character in Downton Abbey). In 2016, it was ranked the 154th most popular name for girls in America. VioletAnother's floral name (and other Downton Abbey character) currently ranks number 47 on the US charts after years of decline from its turn-of-the-century popularity.
